Most of all, we are considering products that will help to enhance the beauty of the sanctuary, our primary place of praise and worship.

Chapel volunteers are also busy working on our grounds, including driveways, the Chapel Gardens, and plaza area. One of the ways we are helping our Gardens is by replanting our Sunday altar arrangements. Folks who wish to sponsor a Sunday altar arrangement (\$100), have the option of sponsoring a saltwater tolerant plant that will be planted in the Gardens following each Sunday's service.
